PROJECT LOCATION:





PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Improvements include new plantings within reconfigured existing public gathering spaces, new concrete patio and walkways, gas fire pits, decomposed granite (DG) and sand set flagstone pathways and seating areas, minor grading, replacement of existing turf with artificial grass, decorative pedestrian-level lighting, 6' tall redwood fencing along the perimeter of the "Lodge" area, and a 10' tall wood pergola at the "Lodge". No trees are proposed for removal – all existing trees will be retained and protected in place. The following descriptions are from the Title Sheet of the application submittal:

Lodge Details

The first area of focus is the transformation of an existing open lawn adjacent to the lodge into a multipurpose space that serves as both an event venue and a casual outdoor recreation area. The design introduces refined paving elements, integrated lighting, and low-impact planting that frames views while maintaining openness and flexibility. The existing turf lawn will be replaced with artificial turf to reduce water use and maintenance requirements. Carefully planned grading and access paths ensure seamless transitions for both intimate events and day-to-day guest use.

Sun Bowl Details

The second and larger improvement area is located closer to the shoreline, offering panoramic views of the Pacific Ocean. This space will be reimagined as a multi-functional outdoor experience zone featuring fire pits, casual seating clusters, shaded relaxation areas, and activity zones. Varied planting palettes, natural materials, and topographic sculpting enhance both comfort and visual appeal. Designed to accommodate small groups and individuals alike, this area supports daytime lounging and evening social engagement while maintaining sensitivity to the coastal environment.

Sign Detail (begins on Sheet L8.0)

A total of 58 new or replacement signs are proposed. The signs will all be externally illuminated (with the exception of the site ID pylon sign which will be internally illuminated and the two (2) "No Cars" signs (Sheet L8.5)) and constructed of Corten steel and marine grade aluminum painted to appear similar to Corten steel. Included in this number are 25 small "sensitive habitat" signs made of painted aluminum or wood to be posted within surrounding dune areas in an effort to keep visitors off these sensitive areas. The locations of each type of sign are indicated on Sheet L8.0 and the sizes of each type of sign are included on subsequent sheets.

BACKGROUND:

In July 1996, the City of Marina issued a Coastal Development Permit, and other related permits, and adopted an Environmental Impact Report (EIR)¹ for the development of a mixed-use resort called The Marina Dunes Resort that included 112 vacation club units, 71 hotel units, a restaurant, meeting and conference facility, recreation facilities and public access to the beach.

The City's approval was appealed² to the California Coastal Commission (CCC) which heard the item in November 1996. The project was significantly reduced to the condition that exists today.

The two (2) gathering areas that are the subject of this Design Review application were created in their existing general layout and condition at the time of CCC approval. The CCC retains CDP authority with the City of Marina continuing to retain all other non-CDP authority. This project includes new and replacement signage. These proposed changes do not affect public access to the beach, the intensity or density of use of the resort itself, or any other approved aspects of the larger project. the proposed development will require a Coastal Development Permit (CDP) or a CDP Waiver to be issued by the

Design Review

Landscaping Plan

See Ex. C (Sheets L6.0 and L6.1) provide the planting plans for the Lodge and Sun Bowl areas, respectively. Sheet L3.0 provides details on the proposed trellis and redwood fencing for the Lodge area. The plant species, sizes, and expected growth for the trees are included on the site plans for each locale. Included as a condition of approval, the project requires a minimum planting size of 15 gallons for the proposed "coastal canopy trees" (large trees, 4 total) and the "multi-trunk accent trees" (medium trees, 5 total). The planting palette and sizes are in general conformance with the requirements of the Citywide Design Standards & Guidelines (Guidelines) including the installation of 9 new trees. There is no tree removal required as part of the project.

Irrigation details and Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance (MWELO) details can be found on the plans.

Signing Plan

The project includes the replacement of the existing monument sign at the property's entrance on Dunes Dr., the replacement of a variety of onsite directional signs, and the placement of several new wayfinding signs. In the Coastal zone, signs are regulated by MMC 17.40.290³ which allow for Accessory Signs, Directional and Public Services Signs, and Freestanding/Monument Signs, among others. Furthermore, MMC 17.40.290.Q.15 allows any permitted sign type that is not clearly enumerated in the Code to be reviewed and granted by the Planning Commission.

Accessory Signs* - Sign of a secondary nature not exceeding one square foot. Such signs are not included in the maximum sign area allotment.

Directional and Public Service Signs* - signs indicating the location or direction of a place or area on the premises upon which the sign is located.

Monument/Freestanding Signs - Freestanding signs of a permanent nature not attached to any portion of a building and not projecting over or through a roof, eaves of a building or any public right-of-way. Such signs may be placed within required yard or setback areas. Site and architectural design review board approval is required. A sign permit is required.

Lighting Plan

See Ex. C (Sheet L3.1) for additional information on lighting fixture details. The three (3) types of lighting to be used in the gathering areas meet the "dark sky" requirements in terms of Kelvin (<3000), or "color temperature", and design (downshielded, pedestrian level, etc.). The City's Design Guidelines do not specify maximum Lumens, foot candles or other lighting measurements, but rather promote "subdued" lighting that limits glare and trespass illumination which this plan does.

Additional Features

The project proposes the installation of a 10' tall, 600 sf wood trellis at the rear of the Lodge building, a 6' tall redwood fence around the perimeter of the Lodge outdoor area, contouring of sand areas within the Sun Bowl area which will be planted with native dune species, the installation of concrete and sand set flagstone pathways, the replacement of the existing grass turf at the Lodge with artificial turf, gas fire pits and seating areas throughout both locations. These accessory features will be complimentary to the overall layout and use of the resort.

Local Coastal Program (LCP) Consistency

Although the project does not include a CDP from the City, the Design Review is required to be consistent with the underlying general plan and zoning frameworks that apply to the property. The general plan designation for the entire site is Commercial-Visitor Serving (CI-VS) which allows for hotels, motels, inns, and other commercial development oriented to serving both visitors to the area and residents alike. The existing outdoor landscaped gathering spaces were included in the original development and are being upgraded and improved to better serve guests of the resort. These areas, which have been utilized and maintained for the life of the project, are ancillary and customary to the resort use. There are no known Environmentally Sensitive Habitat Areas (ESHAs) that would be affected by the proposed landscaping improvement, nor would the proposed project create barriers to public access to the coast.

As described further in the exhibits to Planning Commission Reso. 2025-11 (attached), project approval is subject to findings, conditions of approval, and CEQA exemptions per Sections 15301(h) and 15303(e) of the CEQA Guidelines. These exemptions allow for the maintenance of existing landscaping and the construction of new accessory structures, respectively.

CORRESPONDENCE:

The City has not received correspondence for this project as of this writing.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST:

Commission members are subject to all aspects of the Political Reform Act. Commission members must not make, participate in making, or attempt to influence in any manner a governmental decision which he/she knows, or should know, may have a material effect on a financial interest. Staff are not aware that any Commissioner owns property within 500 feet of either project site.

^{*} Site and architectural design review board approval is not required. A sign permit is not required. However, given the scope of the landscaping, signage, lighting and site improvement project, Staff included these in the PC's review for consistency with the overall plan.

The City of Marina has determined that this project qualifies for an exemption from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) per Sections 15301(h), 15303(e), and 15311(a) which allow for the maintenance of existing landscaping and the construction of new accessory structures, respectively.

THE PROJECT IS SUBJECT TO FINDINGS, CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL AND CEQA EXEMPTIONS PERSUANT TO SECTIONS 15301(h), 15303(e), AND 15311(a) OF THE CEQA GUIDELINES.

WHEREAS, on July 16, 2025, the Sanctuary Beach Resort applied for Site and Architectural Design Permit (File No. SAD25-0006) for landscaping improvements to two (2) existing outdoor gathering areas that were developed as part of the original resort. Improvements include new lighting, new gas fire pits, a new wood trellis, paved and pervious walkways, and other typical tree and plant installations;

WHEREAS, the combined size of the two (2) areas to be improved, referred to as the "Lodge" and the "Sun Bowl", is approximately 20,000 sq. ft. The entire property, which the Sanctuary Beach Resort shares with WorldMark Marina Dunes (a Wyndham Club timeshare development), is approximately 18 acres in size;

WHEREAS, the proposed development will require a Coastal Development Permit (CDP) or a CDP Waiver to be issued by the California Coastal Commission (CCC) which retains CDP authority as a condition of approval of the original CDP in 1997 (A-3-MAR-96-094);

WHEREAS, the proposed development does not impact undisturbed areas within the resort property, nor will it result in an increase in the density or intensity of the existing resort use. The project will not affect Environmentally Sensitive Habitat Areas (ESHA) or impede public access to the coast;

WHEREAS, the subject property is planned and zoned for Commercial-Visitor Serving uses including, but not limited to, hotels and motels, restaurants, recreation and coastal access, campgrounds, and coastal recreation-related equipment rentals. Landscaping and the development of outdoor gathering and recreation areas is considered ancillary and customary to the primary use;

WHEREAS, the findings and conclusions made by the Planning Commission in this resolution are based upon the oral and written evidence presented as well as the entirety of the administrative record for the proposed amendment, which is incorporated herein by this reference. The findings are not based solely on the information provided in this resolution;

WHEREAS, the findings for the Design Review Permit (SAD25-0006) are included herein as **Exhibit A** and conditions of approval are included as **Exhibit B**;

WHEREAS, the site plan and architectural drawings, landscaping, lighting plans and sign specifications are included herein as **Exhibit C**;

WHEREAS, the City of Marina has determined that this project qualifies for exemptions from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) per Sections 15301(h), 15303(e), and 15311(a) which allow for the maintenance of existing landscaping, the construction of new accessory structures, and installation of new onsite signs, respectively.

EXHIBIT A

FINDINGS

Marina Municipal Code (MMC) Sec. 17.56.040 - Site and architectural design review board

The project will not: be unsightly, undesirable or obnoxious in appearance to the extent that they will hinder the orderly and harmonious development of the city, impair the desirability of residence or investment or occupation in the city, limit the opportunity to obtain the optimum use and value of the land and improvements, impair the desirability of living conditions on or adjacent to the subject site, conform with the standards included in the local coastal land use plan and/or otherwise adversely affect the general welfare of the community.

The proposed landscaping and outdoor gathering space improvements are located within the interior of an existing, fully developed resort within the Marina dunes complex. There are no residential uses nearby and the areas under review are nominally visible from outside the Sanctuary Beach Resort property. The proposed improvements are consistent with the LCP as they will not result in an increase in the density or intensity of the existing resort use, negatively effect ESHA, or impede public access to the coast. The project will not adversely affect the orderly and harmonious development of the City or the general welfare of the community.

LCP Land Use Plan Goals and Policies

Visitor-Oriented Commercial Uses (Pg. 3-10, LUP)

"In the event of termination of sand mining and infeasibility of other coastal dependent uses, visitor-oriented commercial uses should be allowed on the properties with frontage on the west side of Dunes Drive." (Pg. 4-12, LUP)⁴

The resort was developed in the mid-1990s as an allowed visitor-oriented commercial use after the termination of the former onsite sand mining operation. The existing landscaping and outdoor gathering spaces to be improved are ancillary and compatible with the approved resort use.

• Land Use - North of Reservation Rd. Planning Area (Pg. 4-10, LUP)

"In approval of appropriate activities, a number of factors must be considered, such as: retaining uninterrupted lateral access along the sandy beach frontage; restricting new uses to areas already disturbed by sand mining operations; retaining parcel sizes adequate in size, location and accessibility for uses defined in the Coastal Conservation and Development designation or where none of these uses are feasible, viable visitor-oriented uses; all parcels must contain adequate shoreline frontage; identification and protection of rare and endangered plants and animals and their habitats found on the site at the time of reuse; visibility of new uses from Highway 1 and from the water's edge; public safety and vulnerability to wave erosion; tsunami and other Coastal hazards; and protection and continued provision of public access from the nearest public roadway to the ocean." (Pg. 4-10, LUP)

These considerations were included in the City's and Coastal Commission's permit review, CEQA analysis, and ultimate conditional approval of the original development.

• Coastal Access – Dunes Drive (Pg. 5-5, LUP)

"Three identified accesses are proposed: Lake Court and Reservation Road (on State Beach lands) and **Dunes Drive (in private ownership)**. The City will encourage specific beach uses appropriate to each of the three locations. This will allow each accessway to be developed according to its own natural character and constraints while offering beach users several different choices for beach experiences in close proximity." (Pg. 5-2, LUP)

As required by the original entitlement, the subject property is developed with a signed, public, pedestrian accessway to the beach through the approved development and includes designated public parking spaces within close proximity. The proposed landscaping project will have no effect on the existing public accessways.

• Rare and Endangered Species and Wetlands Protection (Pg. 3-1, LUP)

"Primary habitat areas shall be protected and preserved against any significant disruption of habitat values and only uses dependent on those resources shall be allowed within those areas." (Pg. 3-2, LUP)

"Development in wetlands shall be prohibited." (Pg. 3-2, LUP)

As part of the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) prepared for the original project and the Coastal Commission's CDP, a full analysis of potential environmental impacts was prepared and requisite mitigation measures completed to the best of City staff's knowledge. There are no known wetlands or vernal ponds within 100' of the areas subject to this Design Review permit.

• Signs (Pg. 5-9, LUP)

"Proper identification is an important aspect of public beach access, even where intensive beach use is not intended. In Marina there is a need for directional signs from regional access routes to local access trails. There is also a need for informational signing to point out features such as the head of a trail, parking and no-swimming areas. Signs should be distinctive and uniform in design, color material to make the access signs easy for the uninitiated to follow."

The only references to signage in the LUP pertain to coastal public access wayfinding signs which are not a part of this project other than the new "Beach Front" mini-monument (Sheet L8.3) which would be located within the development at the existing public coastal access path to the beach. This sign would replace an existing sign at the same location.

LCP Implementation Plan (Zoning) Standards – MMC 17.40.180

MMC 17.40.180.C - Uses permitted in the Planned Commercial (PC) zoning districts shall include but not be limited to visitor-oriented retail and service uses, and accommodations and public access.

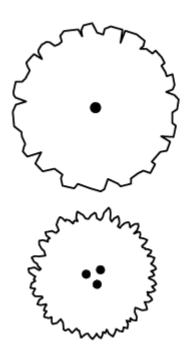
The proposed landscaping and other outdoor gathering space improvements are considered ancillary and complimentary to the existing visitor-oriented accommodations and access uses.

Citywide Design Standards and Guidelines

As the project consists solely of landscaping improvements to existing outdoor gathering and recreation areas, only the Landscape and Exterior Lighting Guidelines and Standards sections of the Design Guidelines⁵ were considered.

<u>Landscape Policy</u> (portion) – The native landscape in and surrounding the city includes a diverse assemblage of plant species adapted to our unique environment. Use of selected native species in our urban landscape can have benefits in preservation of elements of our area's natural heritage, reduction in the need for irrigation, fertilizer, and pesticides, and add a unique character to our city.

Approximately 1/3 of the proposed planting materials are native to California. The plan includes an irrigation plan (Sheets L4.0 and L4.1) with MWELO and irrigation details (L5.0), and the proposed planting layouts for each area. The "Sun Bowl" area includes a Native/Dune Palette for areas which are currently unplanted but will be contoured into features that follow the natural surroundings of the property. **There is no water restriction in this area of the City and no tree removal is proposed.** The project includes the planting of nine (9) medium and large canopy trees selected from the following species. The conditions of approval require that these trees be of a minimum 15 gallon size.



COASTAL CANOPY TREE

MULTI-TRUNK ACCENT TREE

6` - 7` ht. multi min, such as: Arbutus marina / Starwberry Tree Lagerstroemia indica / Crepe Myrtle Melaleuca nesophila / Pink Melaleuca Myrica californica / Pacific Wax Myrtle

<u>Lighting Performance Objectives/Design Criteria</u> - Exterior lighting should accomplish a generally subdued and uniform lighting pattern with a minimum potential for glare with combinations of multiple indirect lighting sources as opposed to fewer, more powerful direct lighting sources.

The proposed lighting consists of string lights immediately adjacent to the existing Lodge building and new trellis, ground level pathway lights, and pedestrian-oriented pathway lights (24" in height). All three (3) of these light styles have a Kelvin (K) color temperature of 2700 which is considered a "warm" color temperature. The lights will be down-shielded and will not

create a nuisance to offsite development. The project is conditioned to ensure that sign illumination also meets the <3000K standard.

CEQA Determination

The City of Marina has determined that this project qualifies for exemptions from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) per Sections 15301(h), 15303(e), and 15311(a) which allow for the maintenance of existing landscaping, the construction of new accessory structures, and installation of new onsite signs, respectively.

EXHIBIT B

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

- 1. <u>Substantial Conformance</u>. The project shall be developed in substantial conformance to the plans submitted on July 22, 2025, as modified, except as conditioned herein. Any deviation from approvals must be reviewed and approved by staff and may require Planning Commission approval and further CEQA review.
- 2. <u>Indemnification.</u> The Owner/Applicant shall agree as a condition of approval of this project to defend, at its sole expense, indemnify and hold harmless from any liability, the City and reimburse the City for any expenses incurred resulting from, or in connection with, the approval of this project, including any appeal, claim, suit or legal proceeding. The City may, at its sole discretion, participate in the defense of any such action, but such participation shall not relieve the applicant of its obligations under this condition.
- 3. <u>Tree Planting Size.</u> All nine (9) of the proposed large and medium-sized trees to be planted shall be a minimum size of 15 gallons. These are the "coastal canopy trees" (large trees, 4 total) and the "multi-trunk accent trees" (medium trees, 5 total). Tree species shall be from the City's approved tree list or comparable if verified more appropriate for this coastal setting by a qualified individual.
- 4. <u>Final Landscaping Plan</u>. Prior to issuance of any grading or building permits, the applicant shall submit a final landscaping plan to the Community Development Dept. (CDD) for approval. The Plan shall include at a minimum:
 - a. Species, sizes, location, and quantities of plants, trees and groundcover to be installed:
 - b. Plan shall provide for a minimum of 65% drought tolerant planting and the majority of tree and plant species are either native to the Monterey Peninsula or considered to be non-invasive by the California Native Plant Society (Manual of CA Vegetation)⁶; and
 - c. Irrigation and maintenance plan consistent with City's MWELO Ordinance, MMC 8.04.310
- 5. <u>Building Permits.</u> Review and approval by the Public Works, Fire and Building Departments are required prior to issuance of a Building Permit. Any work taking place in the public right-of-way shall require an Encroachment Permit prior to issuance of the Building Permit. This includes, but may not be limited to, electrical, plumbing for natural gas and water, and structural permits.
- 6. <u>Grading Permit.</u> Any person(s) conducting grading work disturbing at least 50 cubic yards or 2,500 square feet of a property within the City is required to obtain a Grading Permit. Permit requirements shall meet all requirements of MMC 8.46.130 regarding stormwater retention.
- 7. Permit Expiration. This permit will expire and be null and void unless a valid building

permit has been applied for within twenty-four (24) months from the date of approval by the final approval body. The CDD Director is authorized to renew any community development permit that would otherwise expire after two years. Renewals shall be for one year with a maximum of two (2) renewals. No renewal notice will be sent to the applicant or property owner.

- 8. <u>Terms and Conditions.</u> These terms and conditions shall run with the land, and it is the intention of the Planning Commission and the Permittee to bind all permittees of the subject property to the terms and conditions, unless amended. Amendments to this permit may be achieved only if an application is made, and the Planning Commission or if applicable the City Council approves, any such amendments pursuant to the Zoning Code regulations.
- 9. <u>Conditions of Approval on Plans</u>. All conditions of approval for the Planning permit shall be included on the second page of the construction plan set submitted to the Building Department. If the conditions cannot fit on the second page then they may extend to the third page of the plan set.
- 10. <u>Lighting</u>. The Community Development Director or designee shall retain the right to require reduction in the intensity of illumination after the installation of any illuminated sign if said illumination creates any undue public nuisance per MMC 17.46.160.C. All lighting relating to sign illumination, pedestrian and wayfinding lighting and all other lighting established by this permit shall be <3000 Kelvin on the warmth scale.
- 11. <u>Utilities–Underground</u>. All new utility and distribution lines shall be placed underground.
- 12. Archeology and Inadvertent Discovery. When human remains or other cultural artifacts are exposed, the Health and Safety Code § 7050.5 requires that no further excavation or disturbance occurs in the area and that the county coroner is called so that the coroner can verify that the remains are not subject to medical jurisprudence. Within 24 hours of notification, the coroner calls the Native American Heritage Commission if the remains are known or thought to be Native American. The Native American Heritage Commission selects the Most Likely Descendant (MLD) from a rotating list of MLDs. The MLD has 24 hours to respond. All work will halt with a 50-yard radius until an osteologist can examine the remains, and a treatment plan for any said remains has been provided according to the MLD.
- 13. <u>Cultural and/or Archaeological Artifacts.</u> If such artifacts are unexpectedly discovered during ground disturbing activities, work shall be halted until the item(s) can be evaluated by a qualified professional archaeologist. If the find is determined to be significant, appropriate mitigation will be formulated, with the approval of the lead agency, and implemented prior to recommencement of work.
- 14. <u>Road, Sidewalk, and Landscape Condition.</u> All affected roads, sidewalks, and landscape shall be restored to original or better condition.
- 15. <u>Permit Authorization and Signature.</u> The Design Review is not valid, and construction shall not commence until the below affidavit is signed and approved by the General Manager of the Sanctuary Beach Resort. Conditions are returned to the Community Development Department.

- a. I attest to the truth and correctness of all the facts, exhibits, maps, and attachments presented with and made a part of the application for the Sanctuary Beach Resort project located at 3295 Dunes Dr., Marina.
- b. I understand and agree to implement all conditions throughout the duration of the project.
- c. I acknowledge that any changes to the conditions of approval would require modification of the conditional use permit by the approval authority.

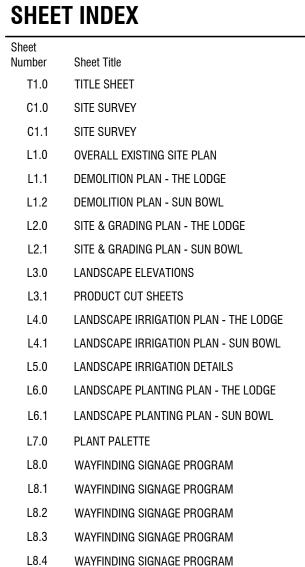
