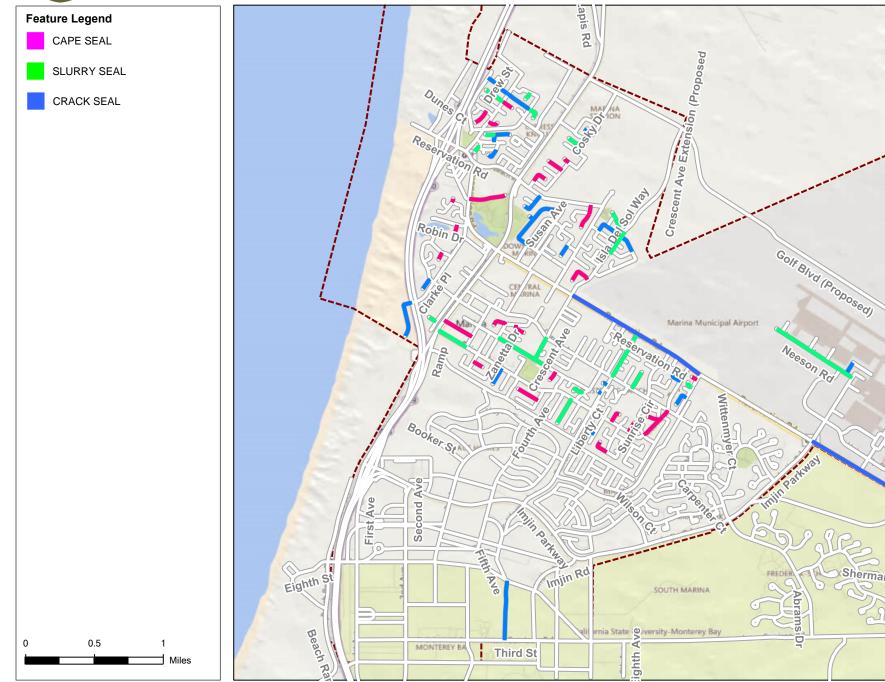

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA RECEIVING THE PROPOSED 2017-2018 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (CIP) BUDGET, RECEIVING STAFF PRESENTATION THEREOF, AND PROVIDING DIRECTION TOWARDS THE CIP BUDGET ADOPTION

REQUEST:

It is requested the City Council consider:

- 1. Adopting Resolution No. 2017-, receiving the proposed 2017-18 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) budget,
- 2. Receiving staff presentation thereof, and
- 3. Providing direction towards the CIP budget adoption.

BACKGROUND:

The City's CIP is reviewed and updated to reflect funding levels and project priorities on an annual basis.

This year staff is developing a reformatted five-year CIP budget document to better communicate the scope of funded projects and the benefit to the community ("EXHIBIT A"). The new format will provide better transparency and promote better understanding of what the CIP will accomplish.

Staff will present new projects proposed to be added to the CIP for fiscal year 2017-2018 in the new format for review and input.

ANALYSIS:

Given the backlog for street maintenance and rehabilitation, a street resurfacing project will be the largest new project recommended for funding ("EXHIBIT B"). Smaller projects are proposed to address asset preservation, quality of life, health and safety, and economic development.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The funding for project additions to the CIP will come from Measure X sales tax, Measure U Business License Tax, remaining Abrams B funds, Impact Fees and the recently enacted state legislation that will provide local funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA).

CONCLUSION:

The request is submitted for City Council consideration and possible action.
