A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA APPROVING AN APPLICATION FOR FUNDING AND THE EXECUTION OF A GRANT AGREEMENT AND ANY AMENDMENTS THERETO FROM THE 2017 FUNDING YEAR OF THE STATE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM TO CONSTRUCT A SENIOR CITIZEN CENTER; IF THE APPLICATION IS FUNDED APPROVING EXPENDITURE OF CDBG PROGRAM INCOME IN THE AMOUNT OF APPROXIMATELY \$39,876; SOLICIT CITIZEN INPUT; AND, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER OR DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE DOCUMENTS(S) ON BEHALF OF THE CITY SUBJECT TO FINAL REVIEW AND APPROVAL BY THE CITY ATTORNEY

WHEREAS, at the public hearing of February 22, 2017, the City Council of the City of Marina adopted Resolution No. 2017-17, approving discussion on Design Phase for possible State Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) 2017 application; and, solicit citizen input on a possible competitive project(s), and;

WHEREAS, according to State regulations, program information disseminated at the public hearing Design Phase of February 22, 2017 must be presented for a second time at the public hearing Application Submittal Phase. The following are program highlights that were discussed at the public hearing of February 22, 2017:

- HUD's allocation of \$27,000,000 to State of CA for CDBG Programs is available to non-entitlement jurisdictions.
- Jurisdictions may submit an application, maximum limit up to \$2,000,000; and, over-the-counter maximum limit up to \$3,000,000.
- Discussion of 50% Rule.
- Need for an Updated Housing Element.
- Program Income.
- Conduct two public meetings and solicit public comments at each meeting (public hearing "Design Phase", and a public hearing "Application Submittal Phase").
- Public meetings must be 30-days apart.
- City must meet one of three National Objectives (benefit to low-and-moderate income persons; elimination of slums and blight; or, meet an urgent community need certified by the grantee).
- According to HUD Exchange the City of Marina LMI is 41.86%, which means City cannot apply for "city-wide program" but by specific eligible group.
- Eligible Activities under CDBG Notice of Funding Available: Homeownership & Housing Rehabilitation; Public Improvements including public improvement in support of new housing construction; Public Service, Planning Studies, Economic Development Business Assistance, Economic Development Microenterprise Technical Assistance, Colonia and Native American.
- City is eligible to apply for grant under Low/moderate Limited Clientele (LMC) who are generally presumed by HUD to be Low Moderate Income (LMI). LMC benefits a specific group of person(s) rather than everyone in an area.
- Eligible LMC are abused children, elderly persons, battered spouses, homeless persons, illiterate adults, persons living with AIDS and migrant farm workers.
- Restrictions on use of activity/facility to LMC is that such services/facility is not open to entire community, serves only LMC and be of nature and in location that reasonably concludes that project will serve targeted persons.

• The Public Hearing Notice for **Design Phase** was published on February 6, 2017, and;

WHEREAS, in September 2017, the Department of Housing and Community Development released the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) noting changes in the program. Some of the changes are as follows: applications are due December 1, 2017, applications will only be accepted from mail carrier and must include an original application, flash drive, signatures and appropriate attachments. Also, the funding limit for the public facilities component has increased to \$5,000,000 from the original amount of \$1,500,000; and, only shovel-ready projects will be funded, and;

WHEREAS, the public hearing notice for the application **Submittal Phase** to CDBG was published on October 16, 2017, as **Attachment "1"**, and;

WHEREAS, the purpose of this public hearing is to approve submittal of the State Community Development Block Grant Application for funding in the amount of \$5,000,000 to construct a Senior Citizen Center (the September 2017 Notice of Funding Availability, NOFA, increased Application funding amount); and, solicit citizen input on the proposed construction of a senior center community facility, and;

WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Community Development has provided a standard resolution template for jurisdictions' use. Therefore, two resolutions are attached. **Exhibit A** reflects City standard language, whereas, **Exhibit B** reflects standard language from the State Community Development Block Grant Program, and;

WHEREAS, the proposed facility will be a state-of-the-art energy efficient single-story comprised of approximately 10,500 sq. ft. The Site Plan is depicted as Attachment "2.1", proposed Floor Plan as Attachment "2.2" and proposed Exterior Elevations as Attachment "2.3".

- Multipurpose room divisible into 3 spaces with flexibility to be reconfigured for dining, exercise and leisure activities, performances and parties;
- High ceilings throughout;

WHEREAS, Highlights on the "Need" for facility: Due to the absence of a dedicated senior facility, the City of Marina is unable to provide comfortable place where older, isolated members of the community could come together for socialization, fun, health, and for overall well-being. Given that many elderly individuals live alone and lack a safe place to socialize, they become inactive. These formerly highly active individuals resort to home. Long-term inactivity along with the lack of social engagement results in frailty, immobility and in many cases, depression.

WHEREAS, problems cited with the sharing of the Rocky Han Community Center are limited hours and services, limited parking, limited space to conduct activities and high volume of disruptions, which has resulted in senior membership to plummet to 100. Conversely, a dedicated senior citizen community center would generate a greater volume of participates as it is anticipated that in Year One of opening the facility membership would increase to 3-5 hundred; in Year Two, 5-7 hundred, and;

WHEREAS, should the City Council approve this request, there will be a fiscal impact of approximately \$39,876 from the CDBG Fund. This revenue was generated from interest earned on prior CDBG programs and will be expended on the senior citizen facility project. Further, according to regulatory statute citations Section 104(J) and 570.489 € guidelines, funds on-hand determined to be Program income must be used on CDBG projects prior to drawing down any awarded grant funds. If not used, then funds are to be returned to the Department of Housing and Urban Development. If the application is awarded, appropriate budgetary entries and/or appropriations will be necessary and the request for such action will be submitted to City Council at a later date.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Marina does hereby:

- 1. Authorize approval of an Application for funding and the execution of a grant agreement and any amendments thereto from the 2017 Funding Year of the State Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program to construct a Senior Citizen Center;
- 2. If the Application is funded authorize approval of expenditure of CDBG Program Income in the amount of approximately \$39,876, and to solicit citizen input, and;
- 3. Authorize City Manager or designee to execute document(s) on behalf of the City subject to final review and approval by City Attorney.
