

RESOLUTION NO. 2024-72

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA
RECEIVING A PRESENTATION AND SELECTING THE SEA HAVEN
COMMUNITY PARK PLAYGROUND DESIGN.

WHEREAS, on December 8, 2021, an on-site Marina community engagement workshop was held to ask local youth what they want to see in new playground equipment. Marina Youth and Teen Center members, as well as members of the Youth Commission participated. Participant feedback trended toward taller and faster slides, multiple swing options, climbers, use of natural materials, and more inclusive play options; and

WHEREAS, on February 27, 2023, another on-site Marina community engagement workshop was held to receive input on future playground options. There were 36 participants between the ages of 5-12. Feedback from this workshop was congruent with the previous workshop. Feedback trended toward taller structures, faster slides, swing options, and climbing options. This group also requested spinners and music options; and

WHEREAS, City Council approved Capital Improvement Project QLP 2016 for \$1,800,000 to purchase and install playground equipment and playground surfacing, and

WHEREAS, both concepts under consideration meet the priorities of Marina local youth including taller structures, faster slides, multiple swing options, climbers, spinners and inclusive play; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Marina that does hereby:

1. Receive a presentation on two playground options for Windy Hill Park (“EXHIBITS A and B”) and select Option 1 as the preferred design.

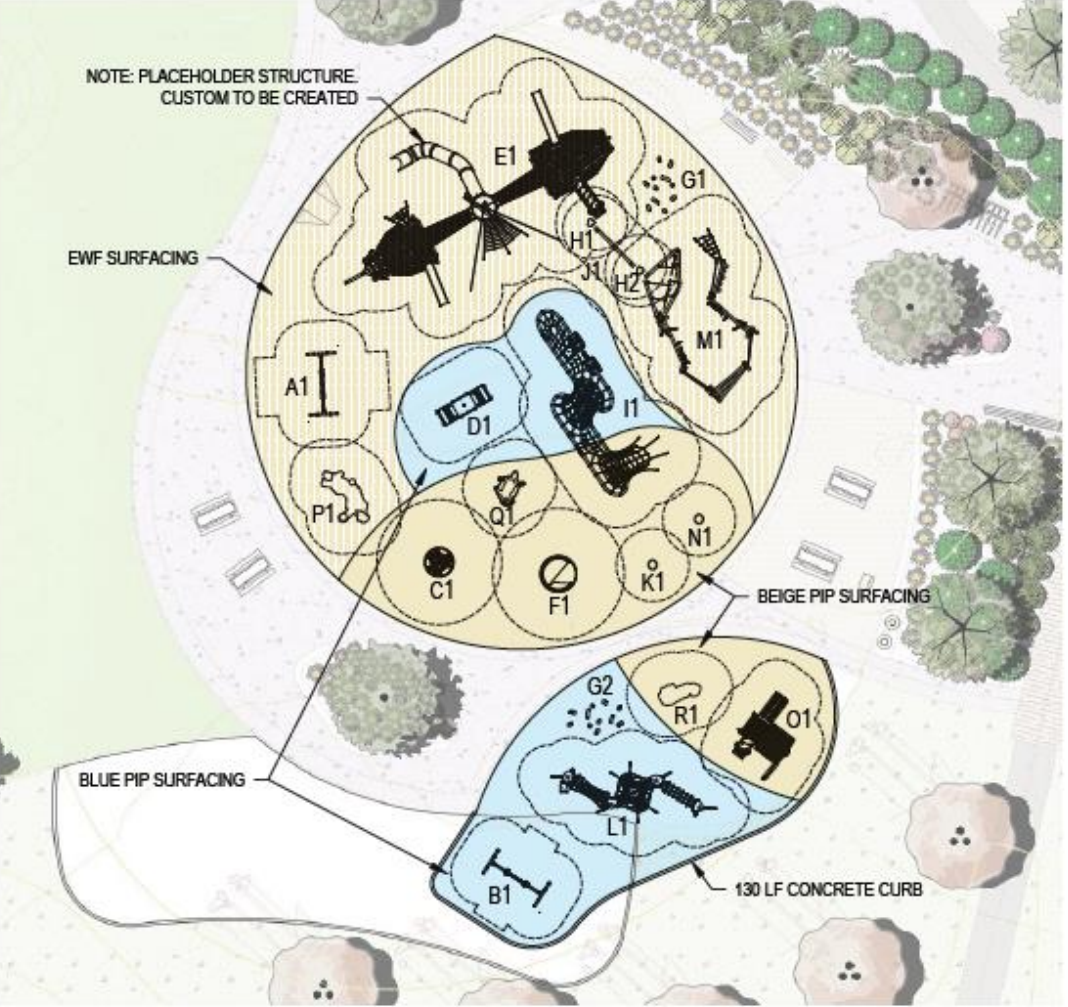

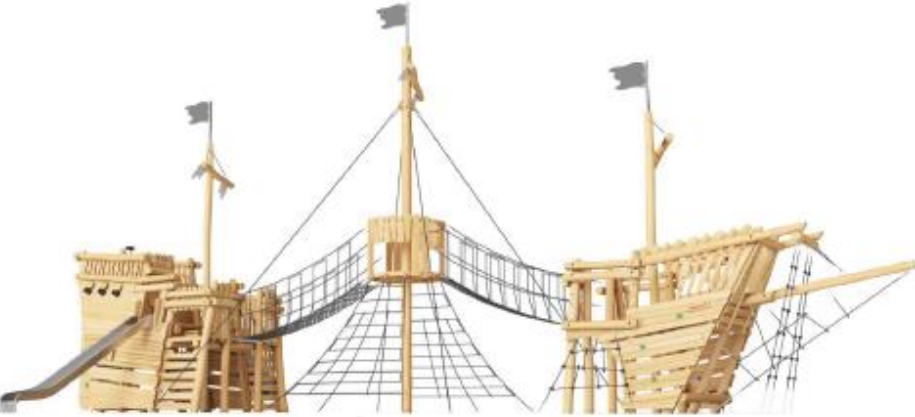

REQUEST:

It is requested that the City Council consider:

1. Adopting Resolution No. 2024-, approving Sea Haven Community Park (“**EXHIBITS A and B**”) Playground design.

BACKGROUND:

On December 8, 2021, an on-site Marina community engagement workshop was held to ask local youth what they want to see in new playground equipment. Marina Youth and Teen Center members, as well as members of the Youth Commission participated. Participant feedback trended toward taller and faster slides, multiple swing options, climbers, use of natural materials, and more inclusive play options.

On February 27, 2023, another on-site Marina community engagement workshop was held to receive input on future playground options. There were 36 participants between the ages of 5-12. Feedback from this workshop was congruent with the previous workshop. Feedback trended toward taller structures, faster slides, swing options, and climbing options. This group also requested spinners and music options.

ANALYSIS:

City Council approved Capital Improvement Project QLP 2016 for \$1,800,000 to purchase and install playground equipment and playground surfacing. However, due to the budget shortage for Sea Haven Community Park, staff requested playground equipment vendors to design a turnkey solution for \$1,000,000.

Both concepts under consideration meet the priorities of Marina local youth including taller structures, faster slides, multiple swing options, climbers, spinners and inclusive play.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No fiscal implications at this time.

The Sea Haven Park Playground Project is included in the Capital Improvement Program budget, QLP 2016 for \$1,800,000.

The estimates of probably cost for both options is approximately \$1,000,000.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

The presentation and providing input for Dunes City Park is not a project as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) per Article 20 Section 15378 and under General Rule Article 5 Section 15061.

CONCLUSION:

This request is submitted to the City Council for consideration and input.
