A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA APPROVING AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO AGREEMENT NO. A-15987 WITH THE COUNTY OF MONTEREY FOR ANIMAL SERVICES, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS NOT TO EXCEED \$50,000 FOR FY 2025–2026

WHEREAS, the City of Marina entered into Agreement No. A-15987 with the County of Monterey for the provision of animal sheltering and related services through Hitchcock Road Animal Services (HRAS); and

WHEREAS, on June 7, 2024, the City approved Amendment No. 1 to extend the term through June 30, 2025 and apply a 16% fee increase; and

WHEREAS, the County has proposed Amendment No. 2 to extend the agreement through June 30, 2026 and apply an additional 8% increase in service fees; and

WHEREAS, the Marina Police Department projects the FY 2025–2026 cost of services to be approximately \$46,604.16, and recommends authorizing a not-to-exceed budget of \$50,000 to accommodate potential fluctuations in service volume;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Marina does hereby:

- 1. Approve Amendment No. 2 to Agreement No. A-15987 with the County of Monterey for the provision of animal services from July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026;
- 2. Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to execute the amendment and all related documents subject to review and approval by the City Attorney; and
- 3. Appropriate funds not to exceed \$50,000 from the FY 2025–2026 operating budget of the Marina Police Department to fund animal sheltering and related services.

AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN COUNTY OF MONTEREY AND THE CITY OF MARINA

THIS AMENDMENT NO. 1 to AGREEMENT No. A-15987 is made by and between the County of Monterey, a political subdivision of the State of California and the Lead Agency of Hitchcock Road Animal Services (HRAS), (hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY"), and the City of Marina (hereinafter referred to as "CITY") with respect to the following.

WHEREAS, the COUNTY established the Health Department Animal Services Center, located at 160 Hitchcock Road, Salinas, to shelter animals within the unincorporated areas of the Monterey County; and

WHEREAS, on September 7, 2022, COUNTY and CITY entered into AGREEMENT NO. A-15987 for the term July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2024, for the use of the Animal Services Center and the provision of other animal services; and

WHEREAS, on January 1, 2023, Hitchcock Road Animal Services was established with the objective of merging the City of Salinas and the County of Monterey entities, for the betterment of all animals in our communities' requiring services, as well as the residents and taxpayers of both entities, with the ability to utilize shared equipment, resources, and personnel; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY serves as the Lead Agency for Hitchcock Road Animal Services, encompassing the contracting parties: County of Monterey and City of Salinas; and

WHEREAS, CITY desired to contract with COUNTY for the provision of services at Hitchcock Road Animal Services; and

WHEREAS, COUNTY and CITY wish to amend AGREEMENT No. A-15987 to replace EXHIBIT A, and extend the AGREEMENT Term by one (1) additional year for a revised AGREEMENT Term of July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2025, as Agency's entities work together to find an Agreement to plan for fiscal substantiality and accountability via the newly formed Hitchcock Road Animal Services Joint Powers Agency.

NOW THEREFORE, COUNTY and CITY hereby agree to amend the AGREEMENT as follows:

- Section 5.0, "TERM AND TERMINATION", Section 5.A, shall be amended by removing "This Agreement shall be effective July 1, 2022 and shall terminate on June 30, 2024, unless sooner terminated pursuant to the terms of this Agreement," and replacing it with "This Agreement shall be effective July 1, 2022 and shall terminate on June 30, 2025, unless sooner terminated pursuant to the terms of this Agreement."
- 2. **EXHIBIT A, "Fees for Services", shall be amended by** removing EXHIBIT A of this AGREEMENT and replacing it with "EXHIBIT A-1". All references in AMENDMENT NO. 1 to EXHIBIT A shall be construed to refer to EXHIBIT A-1.

CITY COUNCIL CONSIDER ADOPTING RESOLUTION NO. 2025-, APPROVING AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO AGREEMENT NO. A-15987 WITH THE COUNTY OF MONTEREY FOR ANIMAL SERVICES, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS NOT TO EXCEED \$50,000 FOR FY 2025–2026.

REQUEST:

It is requested that the City Council consider:

- 1. Adopting Resolution No. 2025-, approving Amendment No. 2 to Agreement No. A-15987 between the City of Marina and the County of Monterey (Hitchcock Road Animal Services); and
- 2. Appropriating funds not to exceed \$50,000 in the Marina Police Department's FY 2025–2026 operating budget to fund related animal sheltering and emergency veterinary service
- 3. Authorizing the City Manager to execute the amendment and all related documents subject to review and approval by the City Attorney; and

BACKGROUND:

The City of Marina has contracted with the County of Monterey for animal sheltering and related services through Hitchcock Road Animal Services (HRAS) under Agreement No. A-15987 since July 1, 2022. In 2024, the City approved Amendment No. 1, which extended the agreement to June 30, 2025, and applied a 16% increase to service fees. ("EXHIBIT A")

Amendment No. 2 proposes to further extend the agreement through June 30, 2026, and applies an 8% increase in service fees. These adjustments align with HRAS's operational needs and efforts to ensure long-term fiscal sustainability as part of a regional Joint Powers Agency. ("EXHIBIT B")

ANALYSIS:

Amendment No. 2 includes an 8% increase in all base service categories, including stray and surrendered animal holding, carcass disposal, and emergency medical treatment transportation. The following is a comparison of key rates:

Emergency Medical Transport (per hour)	\$129.00	\$139.00	+\$10.00

In FY 2023–2024, the City spent approximately \$37,200 on animal services. After the 16% increase in FY 2024–2025, the projected cost rose to \$43,152. With the proposed 8% increase, the estimated cost for FY 2025–2026 is \$46,604.16.

Due to natural fluctuations in the number of animals requiring services, staff recommends authorizing a not-to-exceed budget of \$50,000 to cover any potential increase in demand. In-house provision of these services would require significant investment in staff, infrastructure, and facilities, far exceeding the current contract costs.

CONCLUSION:

Approval of Amendment No. 2 will ensure continued access to high-quality, regional animal care services while preserving fiscal efficiency. The proposed increase is modest and necessary to maintain service continuity through HRAS. Funding up to \$50,000 will provide appropriate flexibility for potential increases in service demand.
