RESOLUTION NO. 2019-36

RECEIVING A PRESENTATION AND PROVIDE COMMENTS ON THE PRELIMINARY CONCEPT PLANS FOR THE PARK AT SEA HAVEN, THE PARK AT THE DUNES, GLORYA JEAN-TATE PARK AND THE EQUESTRIAN CENTER.

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2005 City Council passes Resolution 2005-159 Adopting a Negative Declaration and Parks and Recreation Facilities Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, on May 17, 2005 City Council passed Resolution 2005-130 adopting the University Village Specific Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Parks and Recreation Facilities Master Plan and the University Village Specific Plan provided the basis for staff to prepare a Request for Proposals (RPF) to perform preliminary park planning for the park at Sea Haven, the park at The Dunes, Glorya Jean-Tate Park, and the Equestrian Center; and

WHEREAS, the RFP was issued on July 16, 2018 and four proposals were received on August 6, 2018; and

WHEREAS, proposals were reviewed, and Verde Design was selected as the landscape architectural firm to perform the preliminary parks planning; and

WHEREAS, community members contributed to the preliminary parks planning process by participating in a public meeting held on November 13, 2018; and

WHEREAS, Verde Design prepared draft preliminary plans based upon input from the community, city staff, developers, and stakeholder groups; and

WHEREAS, the four parks concept plans were presented to a joint Public Works Commission and Recreation and Cultural Services Commission on February 21, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners received the presentation, heard comments from the public, made recommendations for changes which have been incorporated in the concepts presented to City Council; and

WHEREAS, the preliminary parks plans will serve as a basis for final parks designs; and

WHEREAS, the City's Capital Improvement Program will prioritize implementation of specific park facility projects and identify funding sources; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Marina does hereby receive a presentation and provide the following suggestions on:

1. For all parks discussed, the City Council wished to:

Ensure adequate water allocations of potable and reclaimed water are available; consider opportunities to integrate Tatum's Garden/Treehouse; ensure design guidelines of the FORA Reuse Plan are integrated; plan for opportunities to phase in park concepts; maximize FORTAG Trail use for horses, bicycles and pedestrians; maximize ability to accommodate youth activities during park concept phasing

2. the Park at The Dunes:

Regional Urban Design Guidelines; Phase in early components for Tatum's Garden/Treehouse; FORTAG Trail to allow more horse, bicycles and pedestrians; consider Stabilization of Barracks and funding; increase bicycle amenities; food/concession area; phasing plan for amenities; develop a plan to phase in trees; phasing plan for barrack removal; consider a use plan for remaining barracks; include a circular walking path; consider additional access points.

3. Glorya Jean-Tate Park:

Hire a Design Pro for Dog Park; obtain adequate youth and senior input; Pump Track downsizing/move location; move jogging/walking pathway to run along Cardoza; include a small and large dog park; replace playground equipment ASAP once removed; improve access along Cardoza; retain soccer field; prioritize restrooms prior to Pump Track construction.

4. the Park at Sea Haven:

Regional Urban Design Guidelines; Ensure adequate restroom facilities for typical park usage; incorporate windbreaks for amphitheater or throughout the park; provide art locations; Hydroseeding Plan B; Tree Plan (skeletal); ADA Access; Access from Denali

5. the Equestrian Center:

look at Ad-Hoc Committee work; removal of East/West roads and/or installation of removable bollards; ensure adequate number of turnouts and arena space; bathrooms; Hydrant Plan; consult the Program of Utilization (POU); ensure adequate connectivity;

Introduce example spatial relations and programming options (bubble diagrams and image boards) and allow for community input for (4) park sites: Glorya Jean-Tate Park, The Dunes City

Park, Sea Haven Park, and Equestrian Center.

INTENDED RESULTS:

- 1. Describe project program and community input process
- 2. Record community comments and input on park programming

| | | II. | During the hours of the community meeting, community members were invited to drop in to provide their feedback. Community members were asked to place colored dots on park elements they were in favor of and provide written comments. They were met by City staff or consultants (VDI) to explain the presented bubble diagrams and image boards, give instruction on how to provide feedback, and answer questions. |
| | | III. | The community was generally receptive to the process, engaged meaningfully with the provided materials, and gave thoughtful responses. The average time each community member stayed ranged from 30-60 minutes. Attached to this meeting report is a summary of the data collected |

from the meeting; below is a summary of the comments received for each site:

- a. Glorya Jean-Tate Park
 - Most of the community members who attended the meeting live closest to this park and were excited about the improvements
 - ii. Community members were concerned about protecting the mural that is currently being installed
 - iii. Bike pump track, dog park, playground, picnic areas, restrooms, and loop trail were the most requested elements.
 - Some community members expressed interest in pedestrian access on Reservation Rd to allow for pedestrian travel to the beach
- b. The Dunes City Park
 - An overwhelming number of community members were in support of renovating the existing indoor pool (29 votes), which required the use of an additional post-it to tally votes.
 - There was also large support for the adaptive reuse of the existing barrack buildings and renovation of the existing skating rink.
 - iii. Baseball/soccer (with lights), basketball, amphitheater, bike park, dog park, playground, restrooms, swimming, and FORT AG trail connections were the most requested elements.
 - One comment stated this site could potentially host Marina HS athletic games
- c. Sea Haven Park
 - Most community members were in favor of a centralized restroom location with proximity to playgrounds, picnic, and athletic fields
 - ii. Playground, restrooms, picnic/BBQ, loop trail, bocce, climbing wall, bike park, disc golf, soccer (with lights), and basketball were the most requested elements.
- d. Equestrian Center
 - Most of the comments were directed towards the equestrian area, which showed support for a more robust equestrian program and trail system.
 - ii. Restrooms, playground, dog park, swimming, and bike park were the most requested elements.
- e. General Comments
 - Community members showed concern for the ongoing maintenance of both existing and proposed parks.
 - ii. Some community members expressed frustration with existing park usage fees and the City requirement that parties larger than six people must obtain a permit.
 - iii. Overwhelmingly, restrooms that are free and unlocked during the day were the most requested item.

PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION AND RECREATION AND CULTURAL SERVICES COMMISSION CONSIDER ADOPTING RESOLUTION RECEIVING A PRESENTATION, PROVIDE COMMENTS, AND RECOMMEND APPORVAL OF THE PRELIMINARY CONCEPT PLANS FOR THE PARK AT SEA HAVEN, THE PARK AT THE DUNES, GLORYA JEAN-TATE PARK AND THE EQUESTRIAN CENTER

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2005 City Council passes Resolution 2005-159 Adopting a Negative Declaration and Parks and Recreation Facilities Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, on May 17, 2005 City Council passed Resolution 2005-130 adopting the University Village Specific Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Parks and Recreation Facilities Master Plan and the University Village Specific Plan provided the basis for staff to prepare a Request for Proposals (RPF) to perform preliminary park planning for the park at Sea Haven, the park at The Dunes, Glorya Jean-Tate Park, and the Equestrian Center; and

WHEREAS, the RFP was issued on July 16, 2018 and four proposals were received on August 6, 2018; and

WHEREAS, proposals were reviewed, and Verde Design was selected as the landscape architectural firm to perform the preliminary parks planning; and

WHEREAS, community members contributed to the preliminary parks planning process by participating in a public meeting held on November 13, 2018; and

WHEREAS, Verde Design prepared draft preliminary plans based upon input from the community, city staff, developers, and stakeholder groups; and

WHEREAS, the preliminary parks plans will serve as a basis for final parks designs; and

WHEREAS, the City's Capital Improvement Program will prioritize implementation of specific park facility projects and identify funding sources; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Public Works Commission and Recreation and Cultural Services Commission of the City of Marina do hereby receive a presentation, provide comments, and recommend approval of the preliminary concept plan for the park at Sea Haven with the following changes:

- the addition of a rain shelter to a portion of the tables in the barbeque area
- Final design shall include a tree plan.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Public Works Commission and Recreation and Cultural Services Commission of the City of Marina do hereby receive a presentation, provide comments, and recommend approval of the preliminary concept plan for The Dunes Park with the following changes:

- Retain the large tree at the northeast corner
- Show connections to the Fort Ord Regional Trail and Greenway (FORTAG) that will accommodate bicycle and equestrian traffic
- Provide soccer seating
- Include foul ball netting

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Public Works Commission and Recreation and Cultural Services Commission of the City of Marina do hereby receive a presentation, provide comments, and recommend approval of the preliminary concept plan for Glorya Jean-Tate Park with the following changes:

- Move the dog park closer to the parking area
- Utilize the existing tree line on west side
- Add a picnic shade structure
- Show the FORTAG and other pedestrian/bicycle connections to the park

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Public Works Commission and Recreation and Cultural Services Commission of the City of Marina do hereby receive a presentation, provide comments, and recommend approval of the preliminary concept plan for the Equestrian Center encompassing the equestrian operations between 9th Street and the RV parking area, directing staff to further coordinate with the amateur radio group and revise the portion of the plan north of the RV parking area, and directing staff to bring the revisions back to the joint commission for approval.





CONCPEPTUAL PLAN - PREFERRED CONCEPT The Dunes "City Park" City of Marina Marina, CA







CITY COUNCIL TO CONSIDER ADOPTING RESOLUTION NO. 2019-, RECEIVING A PRESENTATION AND PROVIDE COMMENTS ON THE PRELIMINARY CONCEPT PLANS FOR THE PARK AT SEA HAVEN, THE PARK AT THE DUNES, GLORYA JEAN-TATE PARK AND THE EQUESTRIAN CENTER

REQUEST:

It is requested that the City Council:

1. Adopt Resolution No. 2019-, receiving a presentation and provide comments, on the preliminary concept plans for the park at Sea Haven, the park at The Dunes, Glorya Jean-Tate Park, and the Equestrian Center.

BACKGROUND:

Several parks have been planned for development within Marina. On June 21, 2005 City Council passes Resolution 2005-159 Adopting a Negative Declaration and Parks and Recreation Facilities Master Plan. On May 17, 2005 City Council passed Resolution 2005-130 adopting the University Village Specific Plan. These documents provided the basis for staff to prepare a Request for Proposals (RPF) to perform preliminary park planning for the park at Sea Haven, the park at The Dunes, Glorya Jean-Tate Park, and the Equestrian Center. The RFP was issued on July 16, 2018. On August 6th, 2018, the city received proposals from Tanka Design Group, Gates and Associates, BFS Landscape Architects, and Verde Design (Verde). Staff along with the representative for The Dunes development selected Verde as the landscape architect for the preliminary planning.

An open house on parks design was held on November 13th, 2018. At the open house, community members viewed plan sheets that showed the four existing parks and bubble diagrams containing elements identified in master plans. The participants also had a pallet of park amenities to select from for possible inclusion. Staff and the consultant team received input from 44 participants. Verde compiled lists of park program and facility elements in the attached report (**Attachment 1**). The report was reviewed by staff and selection of elements were incorporated into draft conceptual parks plans by Verde. The programming for the park at Sea Haven was integrated into a draft concept plan by the developer's landscape architect, Wallace Group.

Staff shared the draft concepts with stakeholder representatives for the Fort Ord Trail and Greenway. Staff met with a local equestrian program operator and received input on facilities that would best support future equestrian operations. Staff also met with representatives from the Monterey Bay Amateur Radio Group.

The four parks concept plans were presented to a joint Public Works Commission and Recreation and Cultural Services Commission on February 21, 2019. The Commissioners received the presentation, heard comments from the public, made recommendations for changes and adopted the attached resolution (**Attachment 2**). The Commissions approved the parks programming in concept except for the Equestrian Center. The Commissioners asked staff to continue to work with the Monterey Bay Amateur Radio Group to ensure that the proposed programming accommodates the potential for their continued use. The portions of the park dedicated to equestrian use were approved in concept. Staff has met with a representative of Monterey Bay Amateur Radio Group and coordination continues. Staff will

return to the Joint Commission and City Council once the concept for the north portion of the Equestrian Center Park are is revised.

Input and comments on the draft parks concept plans to date were incorporated in the plans that are attached (**Attachment 3**) and will be presented by staff and consultants.

ANALYSIS:

The preliminary parks plans will serve as a basis for final parks designs. Final designs will move forward when funding becomes available through the Capital Improvement Program. The park at Sea Haven is moving forward with the developers design team and is likely to be the first park to begin construction. All of the improvements at this park location will be fully funded by Sea Haven at an estimated cost of \$3.4 million. It is anticipated that there will be slight variations from the preliminary plans as actual grading and utilities are accounted for. The basic programming and elements of the parks will remain as close to what is approved as possible.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The development of concept plans for the four parks was budget for in the FY 2018-2019 Capital Improvement Program. Final designs will move forward when funding becomes available through the Capital Improvement Program. The park at Sea Haven is moving forward with the developers design team and is likely to be the first park to begin construction with developer contributions. The City Parks Impact Fee account balance of \$4.3 million will be available for park development and construction. These discussions will be part of the budget review for fiscal year 2019-20.

CONCLUSION:

This request is submitted for City Council consideration and comment.
