


2019 APR1801 - 2019 Project Period - Printed: 3/18/2019

BACKGROUND:

At the regular meeting of May 8, 2018, the City Council of the City of Marina adopted Resolution No. 2018-46, receiving the proposed 2018-19 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) budget, receiving staff presentation thereof, and providing direction towards the CIP budget adoption. As part of the staff presentation, the City's annual street resurfacing project was introduced with Senate Bill 1 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account funds, Measure X and General Fund funding a FY 18/19 budget for roadway maintenance.

At the regular meeting of April 18, 2019, the Public Works Commission received a presentation on the scope of the 2019 Citywide Street Repair Project.

ANALYSIS:

The annual resurfacing of streets will extend the useful life of the City's pavement infrastructure. Streets are selected by the pavement management program to provide the greatest benefit to the street network within the given budget. The proposed project to be advertised will address specific areas of pavement failures within certain roads with full-depth reconstruction patches, or digouts, cape seal wearing course and a pavement-preserving slurry sealing. The project scope will also include ramp improvements and sidewalk repairs along the cape sealed streets.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact to calling for bids. The current budget for this project is approximately \$1.4 million.

CONCLUSION:
